The are pleased to offer in this issue an excerpt from *The Readmore Reporter*, a newsletter about a new back issues and duplicate serials exchange service now being offered on the Internet. This information has been kindly provided by **Jane McLaughlin** at the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College. Jane reports that the list began as a general listing, but that it has recently been split: medical publications are now available on BACKMED.

With the announcement of BACKSERV on September 29, 1994, Readmore introduced to the library community the first in an exciting series of Internet products and services. BACKSERV is an acronym for Readmore's new BACK Issues and Duplicate Exchange SERVice. The initial offering of BACKSERV is a listserv, or Internet discussion group, devoted exclusively to the informal exchange of serials back issues among libraries. The BACKSERV list provides a forum for the listing of both available and desired serial issues in all subject areas. It is being hosted by Readmore as a service to the serials community and is open to all librarians and library staff free of charge.
