THLA President-Elect

The President Elect shall act in the absence of the President, assist the President in the performance of duties, act as Programme Coordinator, and perform other duties as assigned by the Executive.

Specific duties: 1. THLA leadership; 2. Programme planning; 3. Position documentation. The President-Elect chairs the Programme Planning Committee. Its purpose is to assist the President-Elect with programme arrangements and meeting details.

THLA Secretary

The Secretary shall keep a record in minutes of the proceedings of Association meetings and shall have custody of all books, records and papers of the Association, except such as shall be in the custody of other persons authorized to have possession by resolution of the Executive Committee.

Specific duties: 1. Documentation (minutes); 2. Documentation (general meetings); 3. Documentation (official Chapter documents); 4. Public relations; 5. Position documentation.

THLA Treasurer

The Treasurer shall supervise the collection of, and keep on deposit the funds of the Association; keep full, correct and clear record of the financial transactions of the Association, supporting all disbursements with proper vouchers; see that the funds of the Association are disbursed as directed by the Executive Committee; prepare a statement and submit it to the Executive Committee for presentation at the Annual General Meeting of the Association; and maintain a register of all members of the Association. To assist the Treasurer in the performance of these duties, the Executive Committee may employ the occasional services of a professional Coordinator of Membership Services.

OHLA/OHA 1995 FALL CONFERENCE MEETING REPORT

The Ontario Hospital Libraries Association celebrated its 10th anniversary at this year's OHA Convention & Exhibition held at the Metro Toronto Convention Centre. November 6-8. Welcoming remarks were made by **Dee Sprung** (OHLA President) and **Jessie**McGowan (OHLA President-Elect and Conference Chair). Lea Starr (CHLA President and Coordinator of Reference Services, Scott Library, University of Alberta) taught us the new 3 R's: Regionalization, Restructuring and Rationalization. She described the regionalization of hospitals in Edmonton and their libraries' participation in this process. The new system's projected start date is April,1996. Measures range from centralized technical services, to reduction of duplication among the collections, to developing Intellidoc for document delivery, and the creation of a local Health Sciences Libraries Home Page. The timeliness and practicality of her talk gave many in the audience the information they will need to face the pressures of change ahead.

The conference also included an informative panel discussion on setting up a hospital's information management team. Led by **Jannette Hatton** (Hamilton Civic Hospital Library), the panel of experts highlighted the necessity of library staff involving themselves fundamentally in a hospital's information team, given their essential role as information providers. **Janet Joyce** (Royal Ottawa) spoke of changes in hospital libraries and the new more client-focused accreditation process. She described the information management team set up at her hospital. **Larry Taylor** (Director of Information Systems, Hamilton Civic) also spoke about the information management team his hospital put together for accreditation - its membership, processes and goals. **Lou Reidel** (VP Finance, Providence Centre, Toronto) presented a funding-centred view of the health care system, saying that hospitals must now learn what they are making and losing money on. He challenged libraries to help disseminate information related to cost cutting, such as practices to cut lengths of stay and care maps.

OHLA's Annual General Meeting also took place during the conference. Included was the acclamation of Elizabeth Reid (Toronto Hospital Library) as President-Elect and Conference Planning Chair for 1996. OHLA also honoured two distinguished members. The Award of Outstanding Achievement was presented to Verla Empey (Wellesley Hospital Library). Thelma Bisch, recently retired from Kitchener-Waterloo Hospital Library, received the Honorary Life Membership Award.

Theory to Practice. Joanne Marshall (FIS - University of Toronto) defined consumer health information and spoke of its underlying theory. She elucidated the difference between patient education and consumer health information. Jennifer Bayne (Toronto Hospital) described the setting up of the Consumer Health Information Service housed at the Metro Toronto Reference Library. Gale Carew (Project Coordinator, Community Cancer Program, London Regional Cancer Centre) described how her program addresses the various needs of cancer patients, including their information needs.

Some OHLA members attended the afternoon feature theme session with Frank Ogden (aka Dr. Tomorrow). Mr. Ogden is a Canadian futurist and author of The Last Book You'll Ever Read and Other Lessons from the Future. Mr. Ogden spoke of new technology creating whole new ways to do things, simultaneously resulting in the establishment of new industries and the destruction of old ones. He focused on the rapidity of global change, and described some current trends - the declining importance of borders and governments, the move to self-teaching, the growth of retail transactions conducted by the Internet, and the exploding amount of information available on CD-ROM. A quotation from his talk reflects his style: There's a bulldozer of change sweeping over the planet, and if you don't become part of the bulldozer, you'll become part of the road. His whole presentation was a warning to people to become multi-skilled, highly computer literate and flexible, or risk becoming one of the casualties of The Next Generation.

Given tough economic times, conference attendance was encouraging; evaluations were positive; and hopes for the future remain eternal. Thank you to the organizers of OHLA 1995!

WCH WOMEN'S HEALTH DIRECTORY ON THE WEB

The Women's Health Electronic Directory in June 1995, Women's College Hospital made its first appearance on the Internet.

The Women's Health Directory is an electronic network for academic and community workers specializing in women's health issues. The Directory identifies those people across Canada involved in the teaching and research aspects of women's health issues, as well as service providers.

The Directory is searchable by name, subject specialty and keywords. It is written in hypertext mark-up language (HTML) and in future it will be connected to other women's health resources on the WEB. I got involved in this project by being at the right place at the right time, and I volunteered my services to pursue it. I learned HTML and bought Microsoft Word for my computer. Netscape, Winsock and TCP/IP were available as part of my Internet e-mail account through Women's College Hospital.

I developed a template for the Directory's data so that each record would have common fields and standard formatting. It was a challenge and lots of work: Women's College Hospital is not a node on the Internet, so the coded records were sent to Information Technologies at U of T to be mounted on the Net. Some information on Women's College Hospital has been included and there are links to Women's Health survey press releases. The Home Page will be updated on a continuing basis.
