In December, I attended the 12th Annual General Meeting of the Health Science Information Consortium of Toronto. Listening to reports from Subcommittees and Working Groups, I was impressed with the achievements of this vibrant group of dedicated colleagues. The guest speaker, Dr. Alex Jadad, Director of eHealth Innovation at University Health Network, University of Toronto, gave an enlightening presentation addressing the impact of innovative technology on health information.

Patrick Ellis sent a summary of the THLA's focus group session to me. The top five issues identified, with recommendations, are as follows: electronic resources: new skill sets; more effective outreach to Information Studies students; financial and human resources crunch; advocacy-promotion of issues beyond the library community. We look forward to the outcome of the final report.

Reading Information Today, I came across an interesting article, "What's Ahead for 2002?" and I would like to share some thoughts with you. An interview was conducted with twelve information industry gurus. Some of their predictions and issues for 2002 are: "digital copyright reforms will be moving forward as well as wireless access to patient data; functionality, value and innovation will be the basics to rely on; XML and the Web and what constitutes real value for a critical mass of clients; increase in the number of digitization projects for collections to be available online; the development of e-solutions that link different online resources into single display formats" and others. These concerns will influence our libraries in some ways.

I look forward to seeing you at our general meeting in March.


