
At the end of the NEWS we are including Tsai-O Wong's summary of the Needs Assessment Survey. Thanks to all who took the time to give us their suggestions and comments.

DISABILITY RESOURCE LIBRARY NETWORK

Members of the DRLN met at the resource centre of the Ont. March of Dimes on Nov. 3, 1987. Gillean Kearney. information co-ordinator and editor of The Advocate newspaper, introduced the members to the services provided by the Ont. March of Dimes, while Myrna Bloom gave a tour of the Library. One resource in particular, a manual card index to The Advocate, one of this province's major general newspapers on issues relating to disability and rehabilitation, was highlighted with a proposal to information specialists on its potential availability.
