CONSULTATIVE REPORT

Consultative Committee met on November 9, to begin Implementation Plan for the library consortium. As one please of the first steps in this Langlands presentation to the Toronto University of Hospital CEO's on December 15, 1988. They accepted the consortium concept unanimously. Plans are under way to make a similar presentation to the other CEO's of the proposed consortium membership institutions.

of the One recommendations in the Linking Libraries Report is that all libraries participating in the consortium request Academy of Medicine Library, and from the University of Toronto Library first, before accessing other hospital libraries. This has raised concerns among some librarians because of potential costs involved. It was pointed out at the October 6 meeting that the increasing number

of inter-library requests is placing heavy demands on the lending institutions.

The Consultative Committee will be meeting again, early in the New Year, to continue with the Implementation Plan for the consortium.
