Some more cases of members not receiving the NEWS have come to light and been rectified. If there are any others, please do not hesitate to call me, or any other member of the executive.


Hopefully, by the time of our next meeting, we will be out of the deep freeze, and well into a balmy spring. I look forward to both events!
