THE ROCHESTER STUDY

The final report of the Rochester Study "Impact of Information on Clinical Decision-Making", research directed by Joanne Marshall, is now available. The study demonstrates the importance of the hospital library to patient care. Some of this information has been published as a letter to the editor: "Financial Threats to Hospital Libraries" by Robert J. Joynt, Joanne G. Marshall and Lucretia McClure JAMA Sept 4, 1991 266(9) 1220-1221. The information will also be published as "The Impact of the Hospital Library on Clinical Decision-Making: the Rochester Study" by Joanne G. Marshall in BMLA in April 1992. These are invaluable readings for all of us involved in fighting for scarce resources and sometimes even for survival.

UNYOC CONFERENCE

"Moving through the Rapids" was the theme of the 27th Annual UNYOC conference that was held in Niagara Falls, NY Oct. 2-5, 1991. The keynote speaker was Naomi Broering from Georgetown University in Washington D.C. In her talk entitled "Changing Focus: Tomorrow's Electronic Library" she spoke about how libraries are moving from using technology as a substitution for existing functions to using it for innovation and that we should eventually move towards transformation. Two THLA members were involved in the conference. Joanne Marshall was part of a panel presenting "The Rochester Study: Questions and Answers." Joanne also presented "The Rochester Study: Sharing the Good News" at the poster session. Another poster session presentation was "Individualizing End-User Training on CD+ Medline on CD-ROM" by Teresa Helik. For the annual banquet the conference crossed to the Canadian side of the Falls for dinner at Queen's Landing at Niagara on the Lake, stopping at the table rock for a view of the Falls on the way back. Preparations are already well underway for next year's conference in Albany.

FLIS STUDENT PROJECTS NEEDED

Do you have an interesting project that would be suitable for a library and information science student? The course **Health Sciences Information Resources** will be offered at FLIS between January and April 1992. Health sciences librarians in the Toronto area are invited to submit brief descriptions of one or more practicum projects that meet the following criteria:

- * the project requires the exertise of a library science student who has completed the basic MLS courses.
- * the project is a discrete piece of work requiring professional-level judgement and problem-solving ability.
- * the project is such that it can result in a final written report suitable for grading by the instructor.
- * the project can be completed by a student in approximately 30 hours over the term.

Projects can be administrative in nature or they can deal with any aspect of service or collection development. Examples of recent projects include comparisons of CD-ROM products and preparation of library procedure manuals.

Please send a brief outline of the project that includes the following information:

- project title
- * brief description of the project (one or two paragraphs)
- * any special background or interests that are required by the student
- * the name, full address, telephone and fax number of the supervisor.

Students will select their projects by January 17, 1992 and librarians submitting practicums will be notified if a student selects their project at that time.
