Since the field of information studies is such a multi-disciplinary one, you can expect that this space will cover a veritable *pot pourri* of topics. Possible subject areas to be covered this year include, but are not limited to: new and/or improved online systems and services, software applications, career diversity, the *INTERNET*, or any other item that you feel needs to be addressed.

Your suggestions and contributions are more than welcome - they are solicited! We will consider all requests and we hope that you will use this column as an interactive forum to exchange ideas, offer constructive criticism, make corrections or clarifications as necessary, or provide further insight.

FYI: A SURVEY OF THE THLA MEMBERSHIP BETWEEN 1988 & 1993

This is a survey of the THLA membership lists for the 1988/1989 and 1993/1994 years. It started as an exercise to identify the members themselves and the institutions they represent. It produced an interesting set of numbers for further consideration.

Here's what the numbers tell us, in a nutshell.

- Within this five year period, THLA gained a total of 18 new members a 12.5% increase. This
 represents an average growth of 2.5% per year.
- The membership numbers and percentages for consultants, government, and other health care institutions remained relatively constant from 1988/1989 to 1993/1994.
- The number of members representing associations and educational institutions decreased. The latter group showed a noticeable reduction in size - from 25% of the population to 16%.
- Hospital membership continues to increase a total of 13 new members and an jump of more than 4% of the total population.
- More of us were classified as independent in 1993/1994. This either illustrates the growing popularity of the home office, or perhaps it just shows that THLA members are very loyal to the Association itself - even when their jobs and/or affiliations change!
- It is interesting to note that in 1988/1989 there were no law firms represented now there are two!
 In addition, THLA membership numbers in the pharmaceuticals industry and in the vendors category have increased during this period. As the field of information studies becomes more multi- and inter-disciplinary, so too does our membership.

In the next issue of *THLA News*, we will examine the trends for the numbers of each type of institution. As an example, you may be interested to note that between 1988/1989 & 1993/1994, THLA individual membership from the hospitals increased, but the number of hospitals represented actually decreased!

FYI: SPOTLIGHT ON OUR MEMBERS I. A. P. A. INFORMATION CENTRE

One of our new members, Dolores Harms Penner, has provided us with the following information. If you would like further details, she can be reached at (416) 506-8888.

The Information Centre of the Industrial Accident Prevention Association is located at 250 Yonge Street (near the Eaton Centre). It houses a collection of approximately 8,000 monographs, 400 journal titles, and numerous electronic information sources in the fields of occupational health, occupational safety, and related subjects, such as ergonomics, industrial hygiene, etc.

A bimonthly current awareness bulletin called *Info News* is published, listing recent articles published in the health and safety literature. Copies of up to 15 articles per issue are provided. Annual subscriptions are \$50 for libraries, and \$75 for corporations and others.

Other services include telephone reference service, inter-library loans (no charge), and assistance to walk-in clients by appointment. Photocopying charges are 15 cents per page.
