
available across from the Guvernment.

REETINGS THLAERS! I have just come from a meeting with Faculty of Information Studies (FIS) students who were interested in hearing a bit about THLA and how it works. Listening to representatives from CASLIS (Canadian Assocation of Special Libraries and Information Services), SLA (Special Libraries Association), and the local branch of ARMA (American Records Management Association) gave me an opportunity to consider how really different THLA is for our members than many other 'information professional' groups.

Yes, we are more concerned with 'health' issues than other organizations but it is becoming quite common for our users to expect us to be able to answer nonhealth reference questions too. Yes, we may be smaller than other organizations but that gives us more intimacy. Yes, many of our members are located in hospitals that support and rely on the U of T health library services in one form or another but that also can give us an strong edge in academia. 
