

### CONFERENCE TROTTING

Approximately 40 health science librarians from around Ontario attended an excellent seminar sponsored by the O.H.A. on November 18, 1983.

A lively program in the morning approached the broad topic of hospital library services from various perspectives. John Hazlehurst, Executive Director, Women's College Hospital, began by offering his particular concept of the hospital library. A presentation by Carol Morrison, Head, Medical Library, O.C.I. then defined succintly the library's administrative place within the broader context of the parent institution. Carol's talk was complemented by Deidre Green, Librarian, Queen Elizabeth Hospital, who gave an excellent and interesting account of the manner in which a specific patient library service had been developed (through a Summer Canada Project) to enhance the quality of patient life in her chronic and rehabilitative care institution. The morning session concluded with Dorothy Fitzgerald's (Chief Librarian, Health Sciences Library, Mc-Master) informative state-ofthe-art talk on quality assurance and existing library standards. She made particular reference to CCH's 1983 Standards for Accreditation of Canadian Health Care Facilities and, judging by the audience's response, the 1984 CHLA workshop on quality assurance should be a sell-out.

The entire afternoon was devoted to Nancy Lorenzi's workshop on Influence Management. As most of you know, Nancy is Past-president of MLA and renowned for her skills as a teacher. The stimulating examination of (political) human relations strategies in the workplace served only to enhance her reputation further and left all participants with much food for thought.
